🏠 **Government Support for Young Entrepreneurs**

In Canada, there are several programs designed specifically to help young entrepreneurs get started:

1. [Futurpreneur Canada](#)

One of the most popular entry points for youth (Canadian citizen or permanent resident ages 18–39) starting their first business:

- Start-up loans (up to \$60,000 combined financing)
- One-on-one mentorship for up to two years
- Business planning tools and resources

2. [Summer Company Program](#)

Ideal for students aged 15 to 29 (Canadian citizen or permanent resident):

- Provides up to \$3,000 in grants to start a summer business
- Offers training, mentorship, and hands-on experience
- Great for testing a business idea with low risk

3. [Starter Company Plus](#)

For individuals 18+ (Canadian citizen or permanent resident) looking to launch or grow a business:

- Grants of up to \$5,000
- Training workshops and business coaching
- Support with developing a business plan

4. [YMCA of Greater Toronto – Youth for Entrepreneurship \(Y4E\)](#)

A free, beginner-friendly program for youth aged 15–24:

- Workshops on business basics, marketing, and financial literacy
- One-on-one guidance to develop business ideas
- Support in preparing for funding and next-step programs

👉 Ideal for youth who are just starting out and want to build confidence before applying for funding.

💡 Tips to Get Started

- **Start small:** Test your idea before making a big investment
- **Do your research:** Understand your target market and competitors
- **Build a network:** Connect with mentors, peers, and community organizations
- **Use free resources:** Take advantage of workshops, webinars, and advisory services
